ORDER TERMINATING THE CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, in an effort to protect the depositors, other customers and shareholders of The Federal Savings Bank, Overland Park, Kansas ("Bank"), and to ensure the Bank's safe and sound operation in accordance with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations, the Bank, by and through its duly elected and acting Board of Directors, consented to the issuance of a Cease and Desist Order dated March 3, 2011 ("Order") against the Bank by the Office of Thrift Supervision ("OTS");

WHEREAS on or about July 21, 2011, pursuant to Title III of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, Pub. L. 111-203, 124 Stat. 1376 (2010), all functions of the OTS related to Federal savings associations were transferred to the Comptroller of the Currency of the United States of America ("Comptroller" or "OCC");

WHEREAS, the Comptroller believes that the protection of the depositors, other customers and shareholders of the Bank, as well as its safe and sound operation do not require the continued existence of said Order;

WHEREAS, the Bank has entered into an Operating Agreement with the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency ("OCC") dated June 22, 2012, pursuant to a condition imposed in writing in connection with any action on any application, notice, or other request within the meaning of 12 U.S.C. § 1818; and

WHEREAS, the Operating Agreement is an enforceable agreement under 12 U.S.C. § 1818.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Order has been SUPERSEDED by the Operating Agreement, and

the Comptroller directs that the Order dated March 3, 2011, be, and hereby is, TERMINATED.
